Ruth's Table is proud to present *Subject Matters: The Art of Disability Culture*. The exhibition is a continuation of *The Art of Disability Culture* exhibition hosted at RT last year and aims to expand the conversation by bringing together voices and perspectives across generations.

Subject Matters is an invitation to engage with the work of ten artists who identify as having a disability and expand our understanding of the local disability community. At the heart of this exhibition is a celebration of the diverse, personal, and infinitely varied "disability experience", whether visible or invisible.

One in four people have a disability or will acquire one through age, and, although we have some important legal protections, prejudice, discrimination, and exclusion persist. This exhibition features artists and organizations whose work and practice provide a thought-provoking and powerful experience of our collective humanity and take us to a deep place of engagement, curiosity, and connection. Many artists have also become activists and use their practice to forward disability rights, justice, and inclusion.

Subject Matters: The Art of Disability Culture centers upon their creativity, vulnerability, and unique perspectives, and aims to create a safe space to reflect and experience the humanity of others and our own.

We invite you to spend time with the artwork and leave with a new insight into the power of disability culture to strengthen our communities through the practices of interdependence, accessibility, and inclusion.
